PARENT- SCHOOL CONTACT

There is overwhelming evidence that when parents, teachers and students work collaboratively together, student learning outcomes improve greatly. This is why Merbein P-10 College values the establishment of a collaborative partnership between parents and teachers so that any issues that may be affecting your child's learning or well-being can be addressed promptly. As a general rule, your child's Classroom Teacher or Form Teacher is the preferred point of first contact should parents feel the need to discuss any issues.

We also have two teams of Learning Centre Leaders who will be responsible for both Teaching & Learning and Student Wellbeing. They will also be available to work with students, parents and staff should the need arise.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE - BYOD

I would like to remind parents that we are introducing a "Bring Your Own Device" Program in 2015. This means that students can bring their own approved digital device to use both at school and home.

Based on advice from our ICT team, the only categories approved for use in the 2015 'BYOD Program' are iPad Minis, iPad 2s (or later) or Netbooks/Laptops (Windows 7 minimum). We also support Apple Macbook Laptops (OSX 10.8 or later). Other tablet platforms are not preferred for technical reasons.

If you decide to opt into this program, students with Apple Devices may be required to download apps recommended by their teachers. This means that students will require their own iTunes Account. Legally, students who are under the age of thirteen require parent permission to set up an iTunes Account. Parents will therefore be asked to complete the Parent Approval Form if their child falls under the legal age and arrange to return the signed form to the school so we have evidence that you have provided the necessary approval. These forms will be available on our web page or from the school's Main Office.

MERBEIN P-10 SUNSMART POLICY

This policy applies to all school events on and off site.

Purpose

This SunSmart policy provides guidelines to:

- Ensure all students and staff have some UV exposure for vitamin D.
- Ensure all students and staff are well protected from too much UV exposure by using a combination of sun protection measures whenever UV levels reach 3 and above.
- Ensure the outdoor environment is sun safe and provides shade for students and staff.
- Ensure students are encouraged and supported to develop independent sun protection skills.
- Support duty of care requirements
- Support appropriate OHS strategies to minimise UV risk and associated harms for staff and visitors

Background

A balance of ultraviolet radiation (UV) exposure is important for health. Too much of the sun's UV can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer. Exposure to the sun's UV during childhood and adolescence is associated with an increased risk of skin cancer in later life. Too little UV from the sun can lead to low vitamin D levels. Vitamin D is essential for healthy bones and muscles, and for general health.

Legislation and Standards

Occupational Health and Safety Act 2004
Education and Training Reform Act 2006: Sch.5
Reg. 1 (1.2)

Procedures

Staff and students are encouraged to access the daily local sun protection times at sunsmart.com.au or on the free SunSmart app to assist with the implementation of this policy.

A combination of sun protection measures are used for all outdoor activities from September to the end of April and whenever UV levels reach 3 and above.

Healthy physical environment

1. Seek shade

A shade audit is conducted regularly to determine the current availability and quality of shade.

The school council makes sure there is a sufficient number of shelters and trees providing shade in the school grounds particularly in areas where students congregate e.g. lunch, canteen, outdoor lesson areas and popular play areas.

The availability of shade is considered when planning all other outdoor activities and excursions. In consultation with the school council, shade provision is considered in plans for future buildings and grounds.

Students are encouraged to use available areas of shade when outside.

Students who do not have appropriate hats or outdoor clothing are asked to play or sit in the shade or a suitable area protected from the sun.

Healthy social environment

2. Slip on sun protective clothing

Sun protective clothing is included in our school uniform / dress code and sports uniform. School clothing is cool, loose fitting and made of densely woven fabric. It includes shirts with collars and elbow length sleeves and longer style dresses and shorts.

3. Slap on a hat

All Primary aged students and all staff are required to wear hats that protect their face, neck and ears, whenever they are outside.

4. Slop on sunscreen

All students must provide their own SPF 30+ or higher broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen. AND

The school will have available SPF 30+ or higher broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen for staff and student's use.

Sunscreen is applied at least 20 minutes (where possible) before going outdoors and reapplied every two hours if outdoors.

Strategies are in place to remind students to apply sunscreen before going outdoors through reminder notices.

With parental consent, students with naturally very dark skin are not required to wear sunscreen to help with vitamin D requirements.

5. Slide on sunglasses [if practical]

Where practical students and staff are encouraged to wear close fitting, wrap-around sunglasses that meet the Australian Standard 1067 (Sunglasses: Category 2, 3 or 4) and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

Learning and skills

Programs on skin cancer prevention and vitamin D are included in the curriculum for all year levels. Daily reminders are placed in the student bulletin on days when the UV index is 3 or above SunSmart behaviour is regularly reinforced and promoted to the whole school community through newsletters, school homepage, parent meetings, staff meetings, school assemblies, student and teacher activities and on student enrolment. Engaging children, educators, staff and families Staff and families are provided with information on sun protection and vitamin D through family newsletters, noticeboards and the service's website. As part of OHS UV risk controls and role-modelling, when the UV is 3 and above staff, families and visitors:

- wear a sun protective hat, covering clothing and, if practical, sunglasses when outside
- apply sunscreen
- seek shade whenever possible

CHANGES TO THE EDUCATION MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

The final payment for the 2014 EMA was made in August 2014.

From 1 January 2015, the government will provide extra financial support directly to Victoria's neediest schools instead of providing the Education Maintenance Allowance directly to parents.

Parents will not be able to apply for the Education Maintenance Allowance in 2015.

The money will be allocated to eligible schools through schools' core operational funding mechanism, with the neediest schools receiving the most funding. Not all schools will be receiving funding in 2015.

This change to how the money is distributed was required by the funding agreement with Commonwealth government to make sure Victorian schools receive increased funding that will benefit all students and in particular, those from schools with concentrated disadvantage.

Eligible families will still be entitled to receive the SchoolKids Bonus. Please read the information below.

SCHOOLKIDS BONUS

The 'Schoolkids' Bonus is a Commonwealth Government payment to assist eligible families with education costs. The Bonus is automatically paid by the Commonwealth Department of Human Services in two instalments each year. **Parents do not need to make a claim for this payment.**

To be eligible for the Schoolkids Bonus, the parent/carer must:

- Receive Family Tax Benefit Part A for a dependent child in primary or secondary education.
- Have a primary or secondary student turning 19 years or younger in the calendar year, who receives certain government payments.
- Satisfy an income test (applicable from 1 January 2015).

From 1 January 2015, eligible families will receive the Schoolkids Bonus in:

- Two instalments of \$211 for each child in primary school - a total of \$422 each year.
- Two instalments of \$421 for each child in secondary school - a total of \$842 each year.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE 2015

The Conveyance Allowance is a form of financial assistance for parents/carers to transport their children to and from school in rural and regional Victoria.

To be eligible a student must:

- Attend their closest government school.
- Reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from the school.

If your child lives more than 4.8km from the school bus route they may be eligible for both car and bus allowance.

If you have any questions about the Conveyance Allowance or wish to collect a Conveyance Allowance Application Form, please ask at the school main office.

PRIMARY NEWS

PREP REST DAYS

Today was the first day of school for our 2015 Preps. **Reminder that during the month of February, the Prep students will have every Wednesday off to rest.**

WATER BOTTLES

Every student needs to bring along a plastic sport bottle of water (not soft drink or cordial or fruit drink, just water) to school every day to sit on their desks during class. Studies have proven that the brain does not function well if dehydrated. So it is best practice to drink plenty of water throughout the day.

NB: We have the refrigerated water fountain at school where the children can refill their bottles during the day.

BRAIN FOOD

Each child is encouraged to bring some 'brain food' to have around 10am every morning. Studies have shown that small amounts of healthy food continually throughout the day, helps with concentration and energy. Examples are: dried fruit, crackers, grapes, carrots, celery, cheese, plain popcorn. No nuts please. (Not roll ups, or chips)

SEVERE FOOD ALLERGIES

There are students at the school with food allergies. Please remind your child that their food is not to be shared.

BLUE BOOK/LIBRARY BAGS

Reminder that all students will need a suitable waterproof bag to put their library and reading books in to take home. Blue book/library bags are for sale at the school uniform shop. All Preps received theirs today. They are to return their diaries, books and bags every day after reading their book at home.

JUNIOR LIBRARY NEWS

Welcome back to school. **Reminder that students need to have a library bag to borrow books.**

Please be aware also that there will be a fee for any lost, overdue books that have been borrowed this year. So please be diligent in having your child return their library books every week (Books can then be re-borrowed if they have not finished with them).

HATS

Students are required to wear a hat for all outdoor activities (NO caps).

HEADLICE

Headlice is always a problem in schools. Below is a list of recommendations for parents to follow:

- Parents are asked to keep their child/ren's hair tied back neatly at all times.
- Parents are asked to check their child/ren's hair regularly.
- If Head Lice is detected on your child, prompt notification to the principal is important and will be kept confidential.
- If Head Lice is detected, please seek treatment from your local chemist, doctor or the MRCC Health Department.
- If you or the school detects headlice on your child, it is necessary for your child to remain at home until they have been treated and then checked by you to make sure they are clear of any headlice before they return to school.

These precautions will help the school to nip any further infestations in the bud.

NAMING ARTICLES

Please remember it is very important to name all your children's property clearly, especially hats and jumpers, bags and lunch containers.

SECONDARY NEWS

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE/BUS PASS

Students or parents need to collect a blue application form from the school's main office if they wish to apply for the allowance in 2015.

FIRST DAY

A new school year has commenced this morning. All students in the secondary section were welcomed at a brief assembly followed by year level assemblies where they completed their first hour at school by organising their timetables, lockers and books.

At the assembly a few important messages were given.

1/School Wide Positive Behaviours

Our first focus for SWPBIS in 2015 will centre around students being punctual with correct equipment and completing good quality work without unnecessary drawing on their own and others equipment. Over the next two weeks all students will be expected to attend all classes with correct equipment and will be marked on a session by session check sheet. Students that consistently do the right thing will be acknowledged and rewarded. The students that are not punctual or do not bring equipment will have a graduated set of actions designed to teach them about the expectation.

Students will also have spot checks on their work books which will be recorded. Students that are respectful of their equipment will be rewarded and those that aren't will have graduated consequences to help them learn about the importance of respecting equipment.

2/Sun Smart

The Sun Smart Policy was explained to all our students. The key point was the need to take measures to protect themselves against over exposure to the rays of the sun. At this time of the year the UV levels are above safe levels between 9.30am and 5.20pm each day, whether the temperature is hot or cool.

Please ensure you supply your child with appropriate sunscreen that they can safely lock in their lockers.

The policy has been added earlier in the newsletter for all families to read.

PARENT PAYMENTS - 2015 PRIMARY STUDENTS

Dear Parents/Carers,

The school's Parent Payments for 2015 for our prep to grade 6 students as approved by school council is \$220.00 per student for essential school items. This includes a Mini Bus levy that is charged to each family and is charged out to the eldest child in a family.

The three categories of parent payments which school councils can request are:

1. **Essential school items** which parents and guardians are **required** to provide or pay the school to provide for their child and which the individual student takes possession of (eg stationery, text books and materials for learning and teaching where the students takes possession of the finished articles).
2. **Optional items** are items provided in addition to the standard curriculum program, and are offered to all students. They are provided on a user-pays basis and if parents/guardians choose to access them for students, they will be required to pay for them. Eg. Student insurance, music lessons, school magazine.
3. **Voluntary financial contributions** which parents/guardians may be **invited** to donate to the school (eg grounds beautification, building trust fund, general donations)

The school bulk purchases all essential items for students and the Essential School Items charge covers these costs as well as all visiting performances, travel to sports and local excursions and ICT and software access.
