PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Term 3 is well underway. There will be many tasks to keep everyone busy over the next several weeks.

ALPINE SCHOOL REPORT

Firstly I would like to welcome back our five Year 9 students who spent Term 2 at the Alpine School. Melissa Kirby, Chase Carter, Dale Versteeg, Gus Collihole and Josh May coped successfully with the challenges of the Residential Education Program at the Dinner Plains Campus. The program included outdoors expeditions where students were taken out of their comfort zones and placed in cold and physically difficult situations. They were able to use these opportunities to further their personal, team and leadership development. It was very pleasing to be told how well they represented their families and the Merbein P-10 College.

MELBOURNE UNIVERSITY INDIGENOUS ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT PROGRAM REPORT

During the first week of the term break, five of our students: Jennifer Hamm, James Kirby, Zain Neill-Brennan, Julia Mann and Michael Kirby spent several days in Melbourne getting a taste of campus life at Melbourne University. Students from Merbein P10 have participated in this program for the last four consecutive years. The feedback I have consistently received from students who have attended the program is that the experience is extremely beneficial and has helped to open up possible future pathways that they may not have considered previously. I would like to congratulate these five students for representing our community so well and thank Mr Dreyer who attended with them, providing supervisory support. I also sincerely thank Melbourne University and in particular Dr Barbara Kameniar, Program Director: Indigenous Academic Enrichment Program, for their generous support and their genuine commitment that has ensured the outstanding success of this program.

SCHOOL SELF-EVALUATION

I mentioned in the last newsletter that the school will be participating in a Priority Review as part of the Strategic Planning Process that all schools are required to undertake every four years. A key part of the School Review is a Self-Evaluation Process in which stakeholders are invited to reflect on the school's achievements and to identify areas for improvement.

Mr Gary Weir - Senior Advisor, Regional Performance and Planning at Department of Education and Early Childhood Development Victoria, will be meeting with school representatives next week to provide advice regarding the terms of reference for the Review, for example, the timing etc. The actual review is scheduled for Week 3 in Term 4 from which recommendations will be developed to inform the development of the next Strategic Plan (2016-19).
