PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

STEM Day (Science Technology Engineering Maths)

Last Friday our P-6 students all participated in a STEM Learning Day which was held as part of Science Week.

It was an outstanding success and it was great to see primary children of all ages so deeply engaged in the activities that had been organised and presented by the teaching and support staff. I would especially like to acknowledge the comprehensive planning and coordination provided by Ms Ogden and Mr Lord. Beck and Darin are our primary Maths and Science Specialists and it was exciting to see the significant impact they have made on science and mathematics learning since they took on these roles at the start of 2016.

Our values of Respect, Responsibility and Quality were very evident throughout the day and I must congratulate all of the children for the high levels of enthusiasm shown throughout the day, and for the high quality of their work. Thanks also to the secondary students who assisted with the activities and again continue to be outstanding role models.













STAFFING CHANGES

I would like to mention to parents of our primary students that a letter has gone home this afternoon to explain that a few staffing changes will be implemented as from next Monday, 22nd August.
